Might you be interested in devoting a small (or large) amount of time to the effort to spread the word to state legislators, Members of Congress, and other political leaders about the Regulation Freedom Amendment?

The recent White House approved RNC endorsement of the Regulation Freedom Amendment gives us a very powerful message...

"Will you join the RNC, which acted with the approval of the White House, the National Federation of Republican Women, the 2016 GOP Platform, and (for NOVA folks) the Fairfax County Republican Party in endorsing the Regulation Freedom Amendment to require that major new federal regulations be approved by Congress?

Republicans are looking for issues popular with the public which unite and motivate all Republicans, including social, economic, libertarian, business, and 2nd amendment conservatives as well as those who just want 'good government.'

Fighting to permanently curb the power of the administrative state, so that elected officials, not unelected bureaucrats approve the rules that govern us, could well be such an issue.

Every single voting House Republican backed the REINS Act to require that major new federal regulations be approved by Congress, but the REINS Act could be challenged in Court or repealed by a future Congress, and the REINS Act doesn't apply to many regulations that might threaten religious liberty or 2nd Amendment rights.

The Regulation Freedom Amendment couldn't be challenged in Court or repealed by a future Congress, and, as the RNC Resolution points out, it protects 2nd Amendment Rights and religious freedom as well as economic freedom.

Forcing Congress to permanently curb federal regulators could be the most important legacy of the Trump/GOP Majority era, and even a strongly backed effort that did not force Congress to act immediately, would help to deter regulatory abuse in the future.

Highlighting the Regulation Freedom Amendment and the transformation of the Democrats in into a party that believes in "undemocratic" regulatory rule by decree, could be part of the key to GOP victories in 2018 and 2020.
